

KENNESTONE OBGYN RESIDENCY CURRICULUM OUTLINE

Updated July 1, 2024

Beginning PGY-1 year, residents rotate through obstetrics, gynecology, family medicine, clinic and night float. Each year rotations are added to include reproductive endocrinology and infertility (REI), maternal-fetal medicine (MFM), family planning, urogynecology and gynecologic oncology.

- Operative laparoscopy
- Open adnexal surgery/myomectomy
- Abdominal hysterectomy
- Robot port placement and docking

PGY-3

Rotations

- Two months obstetrics
- One month clinic
- Three months gynecology
- One month night float
- Two months urogynecology
- One month gynecologic oncology

Procedures

- Operative vaginal delivery
- Third- and fourth-degree episiotomy repair
- Laparoscopic hysterectomy

PGY-4

Rotations

- Two months obstetrics
- Two months clinic
- Two months gynecology
- Two months night float
- One month urogynecology
- Two months gynecologic oncology

Procedures

- Fourth-degree episiotomy repair
- Cesarean hysterectomy
- Robotic hysterectomy
- Vaginal hysterectomy
- Vault suspension procedures
- Incontinence procedures

Curriculum

The curriculum builds over four years, giving residents an exceptional foundation in normal obstetrics and gynecology, then expanding into abnormal and complicated cases, infertility, monitoring of labor and delivery, emergent situations and advanced surgical procedures. Residents learn longitudinal care by following their own continuity clinic patients over four years of residency. The program reflects national priorities including quality of care and population management. Faculty mentors help you identify opportunities to learn about the practice—and the business—of this dynamic specialty.

OB/GYN GME Clinic

Our residents have their own continuity clinic patients over four years of residency. Obstetric and gynecologic ultrasounds, hysteroscopy, colposcopy, LEEPs, saline infusion sonography (SIS), IUD and Nexplanon insertions and removals, and other minor gynecologic procedures are performed on-site in the resident clinic. Residents see a variety of patients from different socioeconomic and ethnic backgrounds. Wellstar provides indigent care, and patients who are

uninsured and underinsured are able to get comprehensive care through our resident OB/GYN clinic. We provide care to patients with Medicaid, Medicare and traditional insurance.

Clerkship

Third-year medical students from the Medical College of Georgia rotate with the Wellstar Kennestone Residency Program.

Scholarly Activity

All residents participate in scholarly activity throughout their training. Each resident conducts either a clinical research, quality improvement, patient safety or educational project. Residents are encouraged to present at local, regional or national conferences and to submit for publication.
